Methods of Learning

Eligibility Criteria

For all fully funded or co-funded courses, learners must be aged 19 or over by 31 August 2024 and one of the following:

UK resident for the last three years

OR

Have settled or pre-settled status and been a resident of the EU for the last three years

OR

Hold a specific status such as:

- Refugee Status
- Discretionary Leave to Enter or Remain
- Exceptional Leave to Enter or Remain
- Indefinite Leave to Enter or Remain

- Humanitarian Protection
- · Leave Outside the Rules
- Ukraine Family Scheme
- Ukraine Sponsorship Scheme (Homes for Ukraine)
- Ukraine Extension Scheme
- Husband, wife, civil partner or child of any of the above
- Section 67 of the Immigration Act 2016 Leave
- Calais Leave to Remain
- British Nationals evacuated from Afghanistan under Operation Pitting
- British Nationals evacuated from Afghanistan by the UK government before 6 January 2022

Please note that the eligibility criteria are regularly updated and are subject to change. If you have any questions, please contact us.



Fees, Concessions and Financial Support

Our courses are funded by the Greater London Authority's Adult Education Budget (AEB). Fees on these courses are subsidised, some are absolutely free or learners can get a discount, depending on their entitlement or employment and financial circumstances.

We also offer Full Cost (FC) courses where learners pay full fees. These courses are for learners' personal interests and are not supported by public funds.

LISA ELLIS - Stained and Fused Glass student

Looking for a creative outlet that would provide a complete contrast to my job, I enrolled on a Stained and Fused Class course at Merton College. Classes were structured in a way that enabled students to find their own projects. Ongoing advice and training helped us to turn ideas into reality. The inspiring variety of work produced by fellow students pushes me to try new things.

Last year I started to think about selling my own glassware. I knew

how to design and make it but didn't know how to turn this into a business. I signed up for a free Creating a Business Start-up online course at Merton, which led me to produce a business plan that could be put into action. It helped turn my vague idea of selling my glass into a concrete plan to make my dream a reality.

I am now working through my business plan and will soon be selling my work.



Forms of Payment

We accept cash, cheque and most forms of credit card (one exception is American Express).

Pay by Instalments

- If your course lasts one term or the fees are up to £500 full fees are paid at enrolment.
- If your course lasts one term and the fees are over £500 you can pay by 2 instalments. 50% at enrolment and 50% 1 month later.
- If your course is longer than one term (but not a full year) and over £500 you can pay in 2 instalments, 50% at enrolment and 50% 2 months later.
- If your course is 1 year or longer then you can pay by 3 instalments 33% at enrolment, 33% on 31st Jan and the balance on 30th April.

Please speak with our Admissions Team for more details at enrolment and note that you are still liable for the course fee even if you withdraw from the course.

Unemployed Adults in Receipt of Means Tested Benefits

If you are unemployed, looking for work and are in receipt of a means tested benefit, all the qualification courses in this prospectus are free. You will need to provide supporting evidence to qualify for a government fully funded course.

Learners on a low Income

You do not have to pay any course fees if you meet both of the following criteria:

- You are in paid employment
- You earn less than £25,642.50 annual gross salary and live in London or earn less than £25,000.00 and live outside London.

You will need to provide proof of income. For example, this could be a wage slip within three months of the course start date or a current employment contract, if you are new starter, which states gross monthly/annual wages. Fee remission under this category is at our discretion and must be claimed before the start of the course. Refunds will not be given after the start of the course.



Level 2 Entitlement

If you are aged 19-23 years old, you may be entitled to free tuition if you do not already have a qualification at or above Level 2 or Level 3.

Level 3 Qualifications

Advanced Learner Loans are available.

Course Entitlements

All English and Maths Qualification courses (including GCSE if you do not already have a grade A-C or grade 4 or higher) and Essential Digital Skills Qualifications are free for those who don't yet have them.

Refunds

Refunds of full fees are only given if:

- a class is cancelled by us and there is no suitable alternative
- a learner is unable to attend for medical reasons and has an appropriate medical certificate

Administration, resource, examination and assessment fees are not refundable. The refund can be credited on your learner account to use for future courses, but this will be only valid if you are planning to enrol on a course within the same academic year.

Please note we unable to make refunds for absence due to changes in work commitments or in personal or financial circumstances or any other reason for not attending the course.

I am from Ukraine and stayed as long as I could after the war started. I was a power weight lifting referee and I am now looking for a change of career. I have been in the UK for one year and attended ESOL classes in Tooting.

I attend the Floristry course with Merton Adult Learning whilst doing an online Interior Design course. This is the first step in interior design as they both have the same principles and composition rules.

As a learner I found it more effective to learn being handson, using all the senses. On a computer you can choose 1 million colours, flowers and foliage have

their own colours and shades that you cannot change.

This course will help me to gain employment giving me more skills and more opportunities.

The terminology has improved my English and has been beneficial for my mental health — when you are in the class you can think about the flowers and designs and it takes you away from the stresses. You make a creation which lasts at home and reminds you of what you have designed.


Support with Fees
